WE CAN NEVER LEAVE THE FUNDAMENTALS.

A builder will lay a good foundation, and then build his superstructure. However, when the building is completed, he does not remove the foundation. If anything, he will strengthen it.

In like manner, in the field of mathematics, the student may study algebra, geometry, trigonometry, and calculus; but he never forsakes the fundamentals of addition, subtraction, multiplication, and division.

Similarly, in studying our Bibles, we must “go on unto perfection” (Hebrews 6:1). However, we must never forsake or depreciate the basic fundamentals of the doctrine of Christ. Rather, we must re-emphasize and re-emphasize them again. If we do not know what the Bible teaches on basic Bible themes, we need to learn such.

If we have studied them extensively, we will still need to have our minds stirred up by way of remembrance (2 Peter 1:12-15). After years of thorough and extensive study of the sacred text, a student found David Lipscomb studying the subject of baptism. Upon expressing surprise that he would be studying such a fundamental theme, brother Lipscomb replied to the young man, “I’m afraid there is still something about the subject I do not know.” We can never leave the fundamentals. Then let us never forget that each new generation must be taught anew the fundamentals. Only herein does our safety lie! Seriously, may we remain cognizant that we are only one generation from apostasy.

He Never Stopped Studying!

Many years ago in Lawton, OK I had the good fortune of becoming acquainted with Brother A. L. Harbin (1903-1986). He was a gospel preacher who had spent many years as a missionary to Singapore. When I met him, he was almost covered with the shingles virus. He could not wear his glasses nor his normal sized shoes. He carried a giant print Bible and needed a magnifying glass to read even the large print. He slept in his recliner. Shortly before his death his wife told me that one late night, she heard him talking. She went to his study and found him going over memory work. She reminded him that he already knew those passages. He replied that he wanted to keep them fresh on his mind so that he could use them when needed. Friends, brother Harbin knew the value of repetition. We must never leave the fundamentals of the faith and keep them fresh in our minds. tls

CAN YOU FIND IT?

Christ exhorted, “Search the scriptures” (John 5:39). The Bereans were noble for, along with receiving the Word with all readiness, they “searched the scriptures daily” (Acts 17:11). Today, we should heed the Lord’s exhortation and emulate the example of the Bereans. Kind reader, as you “search the scriptures,” can you find the following?

The name you wear in religion? Remember, speaking of the name Christ, “Neither is there salvation in any other: for there is none other name under heaven given among men, whereby we must be saved” (Acts 4:12).

In searching the Scriptures, can you find, The church of which you are a member? If the Bible is our road map from earth to heaven, how can we expect to reach the desired destination being a member of some institution whose name does not even appear in its pages? Think it over!

In searching the Scriptures, can you find, The worship you render? Can you present divine authority and sanction for the burning of incense, washing of feet and instrumental music in worship to God today?

Where is the Scripture? In searching the Scriptures, can you find, The confession you made? What confession did you make before you were baptized? Did you confess, “I believe that God for Christ’s sake has pardoned my sins?” Can you find it in the Bible?

In searching the Scriptures, can you find, The baptism to which you submitted? Did you have water sprinkled or poured upon you when you were an infant—or maybe later? Can you find book, chapter and verse from the Scripture for such a practice in the Christian age? Where can we read that sprinkling is baptism or that infants are proper subjects for such? Also, if you were baptized because you were already saved, where do you read of such in the Bible?

In conclusion, we ask, can you be satisfied rapidly and speedily marching toward eternity having patterned your life after matters which you cannot find in the Scriptures? This is a serious matter!
