“Just Go Ahead And Mark Them Here”

The other day I was in the foyer office as one of the ushers was going through and marking the attendance list. He was peering through the glass looking for some, and as he was trying to find a certain member he said, “Some of them you can go ahead and mark them here.”

As the day went on my mind kept coming back to that statement. I was encouraged as I began to think about the number of members to whom that statement could apply. You know that as we assemble for Bible classes and worship that they will be there. In fact, if they are not at services you begin to worry about what may have happened to them! These people define by their lives what being faithful entails - if at all possible they will be present at the assembling of the children of God. What examples such people are! As you think of that example perhaps Paul’s charge to Timothy comes to mind. He told this young Christian in 1 Timothy 2:12:

Let no man despise thy youth; but be thou an example of the believers, in word, in conversation, in charity, in spirit, in faith, in purity. Till I come, give attendance to reading, to exhortation, to doctrine.

It is great to see the number of those who can “just go ahead and mark them here” includes many of our young folk! Truly they are the examples that the inspired Word charges and will be the same example as they grow older.

For the rest of the services and even now as I see one of the ushers going through the attendance record I can’t help but think – “Am I among that number who they can go ahead and mark here?” Actually this would be a valuable question for each of us to ask. And if the answer is “no” – is there a valid reason for my absence or am I just not faithful?

Now before anyone gets upset with me for saying another is not “faithful” perhaps we could consider such in other areas. If I were an employer and someone I hired to labor with me but was sporadic in being present – would they be a faithful employee? If I purchase a car that only starts a few times a month but failed the other times – would it be a faithful car? The list could go on as to what we clearly expect of those things we know should be “faithful”. What should God, and my brethren, expect of me in worship if I am faithful? (Jack H. Williams)

I Caught Them With A Pole!

Question: Since Paul answered the question, “Sirs, what must I do to be saved?” by saying, “Believe on the Lord Jesus Christ, and thou shalt be saved, and thy house” (Acts 16:30–31), why do you teach that one must also be baptized?

Answer: The fact that faith is the only thing mentioned in Acts 16:31 does not mean that it was the only thing required.

Repentance is the only condition of salvation mentioned in Luke 13:3. Is it the only thing required? Surely not, as we can see by reading Acts

2:38. Baptism is the only condition of salvation mentioned in 1 Peter 3:21. Is it the only thing required? Surely not, as we can see by reading Mark 16:16.

In like manner, though belief is the only condition of salvation mentioned in Acts 16:31, it is not the only thing required. To illustrate, one might reply to the question, “How did you catch so many fish?” by saying, “I caught them with a pole.” The pole is the only thing mentioned. Was it the only thing used? Surely not. There was the line, cork, sinker, hook, bait, and boat.

There were things necessary to bring about the salvation of the jailor other than just his belief. In fact, it is very interesting and noteworthy to observe when it is said that he did believe in God. It was after his baptism (verse 33) that verse 34 says he “rejoiced, believing in God with all his house.”

The point is this: his faith was not proven to be genuine until it had expressed itself in completing his obedience unto Christ in submitting to the sacred act and command of being baptized. Saving faith, in the case of the alien sinner, always includes his being baptized. Yes, faith to save must be active (Galatians 5:6; Romans 16:26). Faith saves when faith obeys (Hebrews 11:7–8, 29–30). –
