HOW MUCH IS THAT?

In 1 Cor. 10:13, Paul tells us that God won't let us have more temptation than we can bear. The question I have is; Just how much is that? The old expression, "When it rains it pours," is certainly true in our lives at times.

Yet, do we give up when the worst happens? Some would turn inward and think that all is lost. We are guilty of often looking to ourselves for answers. It may be that we don't trust in the Lord enough. Paul stated earlier in 1 Corinthians that "Apollos watered, I planted, God gave the increase." (3:8) Certainly, in many cases, we don't give God His time and credit. We try to rush through evangelism, church growth, and even our lives thinking that we will have the answer. God has His own time frame. He took 80 years to prepare Moses to lead the children of Israel out of bondage. He is still working on me as well. We must learn to wait on God (Psalm 27:14). Yet we ask, "How much more, Lord?"

As we look at life, there may be times we must let God take control. There are many physical and spiritual questions that we may not have all the answers to at this time. God knows. Some items have to be left in God's hands. He looks down the road and sees the future. He knows our hearts and our motives. He can guide us in ways we can't imagine or know. The Psalmist said God is a "very present help in time of trouble" (Psalm 46:1). How does God help? He helps us through His Word (2 Tim. 3:16, 17). He has given us everything we need now (2 Pet. 1:3). He can help us in other ways that we simply don't understand; (Rom. 11:33) but must rely on our faith and follow Him.

At times God will open doors of opportunity for us (1 Cor. 16:9). These doors may be ones that enable us to teach or lead others to Him. The door may open to a better job opportunity. When these doors open, how do we respond? We must first learn to recognize the open doors, and once open, not to shut them. God knows us better than we do, we must put everything in His hands. God will work it out in His time.

(I for one needed to be reminded of this Bible principle. We often sing "God will take care of you..." TLS)

THE CHURCH – A FELLOWSHIP.

The church is a fellowship. The church is made of people who are bound together by their common commitment to Christ. Each appreciates the other and will always help in any way that is needed; "But whoso hath this world's good, and seeth his brother have need, and shutteth up his bowels of compassion from him, how dwelleth the love of God in him?" (**1 John 3:17**).

There is to be a special bond between brethren; "Endeavouring to keep the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace" (**Ephesians 4:3**). This tie is stronger than the ties of blood relations. Once while Jesus was teaching, He was interrupted with the news that His mother and brothers were outside. Notice Christ's reply, "And he answered them, saying, who is my mother, or my brethren?" He then answered His own question: "And he looked round about on them which sat about him, and said, Behold my mother and my brethren! For whosoever shall do the will of God, the same is my brother, and my sister, and mother" (**Mark 3:31-35**).

As Christian, we are partners, not competitors. Paul said that if one member suffers, all suffer; and if one rejoices, all rejoice together (**1 Corinthians 12:26-27** "And whether one member suffer, all the members suffer with it; or one member be honoured, all the members rejoice with it. Now ye are the body of Christ, and members in particular."). Christians are to be fellow laborers with God, "For we are labourers together with God: ye are God's husbandry, ye are God's building" (**1 Corinthians 3:9**). This fellowship is to be working together in harmony with the Lord's will; "We then, as workers together with him, beseech you also that ye receive not the grace of God in vain" (**2 Corinthians 6:1**).

"If we say that we have fellowship with him, and walk in darkness, we lie, and do not the truth: But if we walk in the light, as he is in the light, we have fellowship one with another, and the blood of Jesus Christ his Son cleanseth us from all sin" (**1 John 1:6-7**).
