God told Adam and Eve to not eat of the tree of the knowledge of good and evil (Genesis 2:17). Adam and Eve both chose to eat of this tree and suffered severe consequences. The beautiful garden in which they lived would no longer be theirs. The ease with which they had to provide for themselves would be gone. They were expelled from the garden and would never be able to get back again (Genesis 3:24).

WARNING, WARNING

On May 17, 1987, a U.S. Navy frigate in the Persian Gulf was hit by missiles fired from an Iraqi aircraft, killing thirty-seven seamen. The ship was equipped with two types of warnings against such attacks: an audible alarm and a visual radar warning. An investigation revealed that the audible alarm was turned off and that the operator had been momentarily distracted causing him to miss the visual warning on the radar screen.

Warnings only serve their purpose when they are heard or seen. If we fail to have "ears to hear," or are so distracted that we do not see approaching danger, we could easily find ourselves under deadly attack by our enemy (**1 Peter 5:8**). The Christian's first line of defense is to know God's will (**Matthew 3:1-11; 2 Timothy 2:15**). The Father sends warnings to us through His Word and through exhortations from our faithful brothers and sister in Christ (**Galatians 6:1-2**). However, we must realize that if we are to take advantage of His warnings against dangers we must know the truth and be determined to live according to His will (**John 8:32; 1 John 1:7**).

A warning not received is the same as a warning never given.

(**Matthew 13:43** "Then shall the righteous shine forth as the sun in the kingdom of their Father. Who hath ears to hear, let him hear.")

Matthew 13:14-16 "And in them is fulfilled the prophecy of Esaias, which saith, by hearing ye shall hear, and shall not understand; and seeing ye shall see, and shall not perceive: For this people's heart is waxed gross, and their ears are dull of hearing, and their eyes they have closed; lest at any time they should see with their eyes, and hear with their ears, and should understand with their heart, and should be converted, and I should heal them. But blessed are your eyes, for they see: and your ears, for they hear."
