JUST WHO ARE THE UNDERDOGS?

One term that has become familiar to so many people is the term “underdog.” The word under- dog means, “the one that is losing as in a contest; one that is handicapped, underprivileged, un-favored, etc.” Often, we find use of this word in connection with athletic events. One team may be seen as the underdog while the other team is favored to win. However, it seems that there has been a gross misapplication of these thoughts. Some seem to look upon Christians as the underdogs in life. Such thinking is far from true. The following favors the Christian.

The strength of Christ. Paul noted, “I can do all things through Christ which strengtheneth me” (Phi. 4:13). We are told, “For when we were yet without strength, in due time Christ died for the ungodly” (Rom. 5:6). God gave Jesus, “power over all flesh, that he should give eternal life to as many as thou hast given him” (John 17:2). Man indeed left to himself is given that Jesus has promised this strength to all who will seek and obey Him.

The power of God. David spoke this truth concerning God, “thou reignest over all; and in thine hand is power and might; and in thine hand it is to make great; and to give strength unto all” (1 Chronicles 29:12). Jesus stated, “with God all things are possible” (Matthew 19:26). The Christian has the promise that “God shall supply all your need according to his riches in glory by Christ Jesus” (Philippians 4:19). God’s power reigns supreme and Christians have that power working for them.

The force of the Word as given through the Spirit. The Bible is the inspired Word of God given through the Holy Spirit, “That the man of God may be perfect, throughly furnished unto all good works” (2 Timothy 3:17). “Holy men of God spake as they were moved by the Holy Ghost” (2 Peter 1:21). The Gospel is “the power of God unto salvation” (Romans 1:16). The psalmist noted, “Thy word is a lamp unto my feet and

a light unto my path” (Psalm 119:105). The Christian’s desire- with- expectation is firmly implanted in the truth of God’s Word.

Christians may be a minority population wise, but as one can plainly observe from these facts, the Christian is nowhere near being the “under-dog” in this life.

THINK ABOUT IT...

The New Testament of Jesus Christ contains: 181,253 words; 7,959 verses; 260 chapters and 27 books. Did you know the average reader who reads 8 verses a minute and spends 30 minutes a day can read the entire New Testament through in 30 days? Do that every day and you would have read the New Testament through 12 times in a year. Do that for just 10 years and one will have read the New Testament 120 times!

Our unfamiliarity with the Bible is a witness against us. No larger than what the New Testament is, why have we not learned that material? Some have been Christians for years, decades even, yet, will fumble through the pages unsure of our destination.

You would think that a book, the only book, which gives us directions to Heaven would be consumed and devoured by people wanting to go to Heaven. You would think that such a small amount of material, which directly affects our eternal destiny would be read, studied, analyzed, and lived (James 1:21-25).

Friends, there is no excuse. Our lack of understanding betrays us. We have chosen the world over the Word. However, it is not too late! Start spending half an hour every day for those next ten years and you will have read the New Testament through 120 times! Think of it! Spending just a little time every day can bring forth great results! The question is, will we take the time to know God’s will for us? (Adapted)
