A DEBT WE CANNOT PAY...

A large percentage of people are deeply in financial debt. They owe for such things as their house, automobile, medical expenses, credit cards, and personal loans. Our society is one that lives on borrowed money. Not only is this true, but our nation is deeply in debt!

As a nation, we owe trillions of dollars. It does not seem many of our elected officials are concerned about this. Perhaps this is because they are more politician than statesmen.

There is no question we owe a debt that is impossible for us to pay. When we sin there is no way, on our own, we can escape the consequences of it. It is only in Christ the price of our sin can be paid. He purchased the redeemed in His church with His own blood (**Acts 20:28**).

Jesus spoke a parable bringing this truth out with emphasis on our need to forgive others as the Lord has forgiven us. Hear His Words concerning this:

“Therefore, is the kingdom of heaven likened unto a certain king, which would take account of his servants. And when he had begun to reckon, one was brought unto him, which owed him ten thousand talents. But forasmuch as he had not to pay, his lord commanded him to be sold, and his wife, and children, and all that he had, and payment to be made. The servant therefore fell down, and worshipped him, saying, Lord, have patience with me, and I will pay thee all. Then the lord of that servant was moved with compassion, and loosed him, and forgave him the debt. But the same servant went out, and found one of his fellowservants, which owed him an hundred pence: and he laid hands on him, and took him by the throat, saying, Pay me that thou owest.

And his fellowservant fell down at his feet, and besought him, saying, have patience with me, and I will pay thee all. And he would not: but went and cast him into prison, till he should pay the debt. So, when his fellowservants saw what was done, they were very sorry, and came and told unto their lord all that was done. Then his lord, after that he had called him, said unto him, O thou wicked servant, I forgave thee all that debt, because thou desiredst me: Shouldest not thou also have had compassion on thy fellowservant, even as I had pity on thee? And his lord was wroth, and delivered him to the tormentors, till he should pay all that was due unto him. So likewise, shall my heavenly Father do also unto you, if ye from your hearts forgive not everyone his brother their trespasses.” (**Matthew 18:23-35**).

“WHAT MUST I DO TO BE SAVED?”

The greatest question we may ask is answered plainly in God’s Word. God encourages us to be noble enough to examine these teachings (Acts 17:11). and then to love Him enough to obey them (John 14:15).

I may only come to Him through Christ (Hebrews 5:9; John 14:6).

I must have faith that comes through study of His Word (Heb. 11:6; Rom. 10:17).

I must repent of my sins (Acts 2:38; 17:30).

I must confess Him before others (Acts 8:36-37).

I must be baptized for the remission of sins (Acts 2:38; 22:16).

I must live faithfully to His Word (1 John 1:5-9).
