Find a Bridge ... Be A Bridge

Have you thought much about bridges? Recently we have been getting a lot of rain around here. I've started to experience driving in the rain as well and now that I am driving and even when I was a kid, I remember riding in the car in the rain. Every time I would be riding in a car in the rain and we would pass under a bridge I would be so excited because for a split second it was like the rain just stopped. Even now that I am driving, I've started to realize a sense of peace when drive under those bridges because it gives a break from the stress of driving in the rain. I started to think about it and I realized that this has an application to our Christian lives as well.

When we are going through our day to day lives through the week, we can start to feel isolated in this world and sometimes we can feel all alone. But when we come to church on a Wednesday night and Sunday and we get encouraged by others and have that fellowship with others, it helps us find a similar sense of peace. In Hebrews 10:25 it says we are to be "not forsaking the assembling of ourselves together, as the manner of some is; but exhorting one another: and so much the more, as ye see the day approaching". When we are out in this world and it feels like the rain is beginning to pour in our lives, we need to look forward to these church services or just reach out to our brothers and sisters in Christ to help us and encourage us. We need to realize that if we skip out on these services and fellowship with other Christians and we miss these "bridges" the rain will start to become unbearable for us.

But on the other side of that as well, we need to be the bridges for others. We need to look to the opportunity of helping others when the rain is starting to pour on them and it seems that the world is starting to overwhelm them. In Proverbs 17 and verse 17 it says "A friend loveth at all times, and a brother is born for adversity". As fellow Christians we need to be there for others at all times, but especially in times of adversity and when you know that they are going through a lot. We also see this in Galatians 6:2 2 when it tells us to "bear ye one another's burdens".

Recently we have seen rain that has poured and we have also seen some slight drizzles. We never know when it is pouring on someone and they are extremely over whelmed or sometimes when it is just drizzling on them. But either way, we have to be that bridge that can bring them comfort at all times.

Lastly, the most powerful bridge that we have that can give us peace no matter how strong the storm, is the power of prayer. No matter where you are or what you are going through, no matter what the world is throwing at you, you can shut it all out and have more peace than anything in this world can bring you simply by casting your cares on God in prayer like it says in 1 Peter 5:7. When we build a relationship with God, no matter what we are going through we can look to Him in prayer. That is when we know we can make it through anything because He is far stronger than anything we will come up against (Romans 8:31).

To begin and build that relationship with God we must first hear God's Word that produces faith (Romans 10:17). Then having that necessary faith (Hebrews 11:6), we are to repent (Luke 13:3), confess (Matthew 10:32), and then be baptized for the remission of our sins (Acts 2:38). Then we are to remain faithful unto death (Revelation 2:10). If you follow these steps set forth for us by God in His Word you can have that relationship with God and with those around you and will be able to find peace in anything that is in front of you.

"What Must I Do To Be Saved?"

The greatest question we may ask is answered plainly in God's Word. God encourages us to be noble enough to examine these teachings (Acts 17:11) and then to love Him enough to obey them (John 14:15).

I must have faith that comes through study of His Word (Hebrews 11:6; Romans 10:17).

I must repent of my sins (Acts 2:38; 17:30).

I must confess Him before others (Acts 8:36-37).

I must be baptized for the remission of sins (Acts 2:38; 22:16).

I must live faithfully to His Word (1 John 1:5-9).
