“DID YOU WASH BEHIND YOUR EARS?”

If you were to make a list of “Top 10 Mother Quotes,” one of them would HAVE to be, “Did you wash behind your ears?” And, if your mother is like mine, regardless of how you responded, she would check. I don’t know what she expected to find, but evidently that’s one body-area we tend to neglect.

I’m pretty sure it’s not the small area behind our ears that mothers are concerned about... I think dirt behind the ears might indicate a bigger problem. Maybe we’re not taking the whole “bath thing” seriously enough. The back side of the ears is just a kind of litmus test.

I propose to you that there might be some litmus tests which indicate how serious we are about our Christianity. If you were given the responsibility of choosing a litmus test that would indicate how seriously someone is about their commitment to the Lord, what would it be?

My suggestion would be that the consistency of our attendance at every assembly and Bible classes might be a pretty good indicator. Another one might be... do we study your Bible regularly?

It also occurs to me that it’s not so much the act of attending every assembly or the act of studying our Bible... it’s more about what these things indicate about how seriously we are serious about our commitment to the Lord. **Check behind your ears.** —

“PRIORITIES...”

Priorities are a necessary part of life. When we arise each day, we immediately begin to place priorities on the things we must do. It may be that breakfast occupies the number one spot on our daily list of duties, or perhaps getting to work/school on time is the most important thing (for me, it’s that first cup of coffee!). Either way, we unconsciously assign values to the things we do.

This is also true in the spiritual realm. We set priorities on worshipping on Sunday evenings, attending the Wednesday night bible studies, our personal study habits, giving, evangelism, and so on. **Matthew 6:33** instructs us to, “seek first the kingdom of God.” The Savior, through His church, is to have "first call" on our time and talents: Neither our jobs, nor even our families, are more important. Our participation (or lack of it) in spiritual things such as worship, evangelism, and visitation is generally a direct and accurate measure of how valued and important these things are to us. The Psalmist said, "I made hast and delayed not to keep they commandments" (**Psalms 119:60**). Think about this, brethren.

Our life is the sum total of all the decisions we make every day, and those decisions are determined by our priorities.

“THE DASH”

I read of a man who stood to speak at the funeral of a friend. He referred to the dates on her tombstone, from beginning to the end. He noted that first came her date of birth, and spoke the following date with tears, but he said what mattered most of all, was the dash between the years. For that dash represents all the time that she spent alive on earth... And now only those who loved her, know what that little line is worth.

For it matters not, how much we own; the cars...the house...the cash, what matters is how we live and love and how we spend our dash. So think about this long and hard. Are there things you'd like to change? For you never know how much time is left that can still be rearranged.

If we could just slow down enough to consider what’s true and real, and al-ways try to understand the way other people feel. Would we be less quick to anger? Would we show appreciation more and love the people in our lives like we never loved before? Would we treat each other with respect and more often wear a smile?
