A Voice From The Past...

A WORTHY EXAMPLE

Garland Elkins (8/19/1926 - 10/28/2016)

It was Joshua who said, “Choose you this day whom ye will serve...but as for me and my house, we will serve the Lord” (Joshua 24:15).

Joshua, the successor of Moses, stood tall and firm before the Israelites. From our viewpoint, he still maintains that great spiritual stature. He sought to confirm the faith of his brethren and to encourage their obedience to God. There was no egotism in his character, but there was grim determination, unswerving faith, and indomitable courage. These were very necessary to the conquest of Canaan, and to the influential leadership of Israel. It is said, to Joshua’s everlasting credit, “And Israel served the Lord all the days of Joshua, and all the days of the elders that outlived Joshua, and which had known all the works of the Lord, that he had done for Israel” (Joshua 24:31).

It is especially commendable and so very praiseworthy that he not only resolved to serve the Lord, but that he also fully intended that his family should serve the Lord. How desperately needed are such fathers in our day! Joshua, Noah and Cornelius serve as tremendous inspiration to all fathers who are serious as pertains to their responsibility in this matter. Paul wrote, “And, ye fathers, provoke not your children to wrath: but bring them up in the nurture and admonition of the Lord” (Ephesians 6:4).

Joshua and all Israel had the privilege of choice. Just as it was in the days of Joshua, so now people must choose whom they will serve. God has no draftees in His army – He only has volunteers.

Under the New Testament, and in the Christian dispensation, we need the same excellent characteristics that Joshua manifested – the same grim determination, the same unswerving faith, the same indomitable courage, the same wise decision.

If we have the wisdom to make the right choice, the determination to live up to that choice, the courage to take the lead for our own soul’s sake, and for the sake of those whom we might influence, especially our families, and the faith to do just what the Lord requires, we shall be happier here and happy throughout eternity.

We are reminded of the inspired Paul’s fivefold command: “Watch ye, stand fast in the faith, quit you like men, be strong. Let all that ye do be done in love” (1 Corinthians 16:13-14). We, in the sunlight age, should do better than Joshua; but many do not do as well. Let us repeat his resolution until it becomes a part of our lives, “As for me and my house, we will serve the Lord” (Joshua 24:15).

INTEGEITY...

The story is told of a Christian high school senior who was honored as one of the best and brightest in his community because he provided a forceful demonstration of integrity.

We don’t know when our actions may become an example to others – we’re always on display. But if we live each day to honor Jesus, our behavior will model His righteous life (***Galatians 2:20; 1 John 2:5-6***), no matter who is watching.

Uprightness and honor should be goals for Christians of every age. Paul told Timothy:

“Let no man despise thy youth; but be thou an example of the believers, in word, in conversation, in charity, in spirit, in faith, in purity.” (***1 Timothy 4:12***).
