The Power of An Example

Even wicked men understand the power of an example. When “Vashti the queen” refused the behest of her king “to show the people and the princes her beauty,” other state officials were concerned about her denial and its effects.

“And Memucan answered before the king and the princes, Vashti the queen hath not done wrong to the king only, but also to all the princes, and to all the people that are in all the provinces of the king Ahasuerus. For this deed of the queen shall come abroad unto all women so that they shall despise their husbands in their eyes when it shall be reported, The king Ahasuerus commanded Vashti the queen to be brought in before him, but she came not. Likewise, shall the ladies of Persia and Media say this day unto all the king's princes, which have heard of the deed of the queen. Thus, shall there arise too much contempt and wrath? If it please the king, let there go a royal commandment from him, and let it be written among the laws of the Persians and the Medes, that it be not altered, That Vashti come no more before king Ahasuerus; and let the king give her royal estate unto another that is better than she. And when the king's decree which he shall make shall be published throughout all his empire, (for it is great,) all the wives shall give to their husbands honor, both to great and small. And the saying pleased the king and the princes, and the king did according to the word of Memucan” (Esther 1:16-21).

We are not dismissing neither the virtue nor the valor of Vashti. In this article, we are simply showing that her example exerted power and influence on others, and the men of her day recognized it! Her example could influence others to proper living.

One of the sad facts of our era is that public figures, from entertainers and ball players to politicians, often have no sense of shame. Neither do they have a sense of the magnitude of the effect of their disgraceful, decadent, and depraved lifestyles. The more they flaunt their despicable behavior, the greater their popularity and riches. As Vashti's example shows, one person can impact many others.

Let us be keenly aware of our own behavior and its effect upon our children, our neighbors, and our brethren. “Let your light so shine before men, that they may see your good works and glorify your Father in heaven” (Matthew 5:16). “Let no one despise thy youth but be thou an example of the believers in word, in conversation, in charity, in spirit, in faith, in purity” (1 Timothy 4:12). Living Sacrifices

Every Christian is to be a living sacrifice for Christ (Romans 12:1-2). In this challenging call to Christian living, Paul is emphasizing the need to be set apart from all ungodly living. He is saying, live differently than the world. Someone once said, “Total sacrificial living is life indeed.”

The saint is to be a living sacrifice. The Old Testament required the bloody sacrifice of animals (Hebrews 10:1). In the New Testament we are not admonished to make these animal sacrifices, however, we are called upon to make a daily sacrifice of ourselves. We must lay down our lives for the Lord (Matthew 16:25). We must be willing to give up anything to be a disciple of Christ (Luke 14:33). The Macedonian Christians gave liberally of their money and goods to the Lord, but we must understand they “first gave their own selves to the Lord” (2 Corinthians 8:5).

All of this means that the Christian is to keep himself from the things of the world that would take Him away from God. The temptations of that lifestyle can be overcome if we are willing to make a sacrifice. I have heard some say, “Do I have to give up everything to be pleasing to God?” Or some say, “That's too restrictive.” Truth is, we must all make a sacrifice if we are to be holy in His sight.
