LAYING LIFE ON THE LINE.

As a New York skyscraper went up, hundreds paused daily to glance up at it. One day, they watched a ponderous metal beam go up to take its place in the steel skeleton. As the girder came near, a workman leaned out from the sixteenth floor to seize it. The spectators gasped as he lost his balance and fell. Desperately, he clutched the girder's end with arms and legs. The ground crew stopped the hoisting engine, but the man's weight at one end began to tilt the beam to a vertical position, which would eventually cause him to lose his grasp and fall to his death. With swift decision, another worker on the same floor, seeing his friend's predicament, leaped through space and landed on the other end, where his weight leveled the beam. Amid the applause of the crowd, both men were safely lowered to the street.

Every day, people around us lose their balance on moral questions — they consider having an affair with a coworker, taking company funds, lying to close a deal, toying with drugs and alcohol. Wrong decisions may hurt them and their families for years and cost their souls in eternity. They need friends interested in helping them keep their balance by exemplary lives, by sacrificial living, by speaking a word for Christ. Here no one applauds, but it will be worth it all when we receive the approval of the Master (**1 Corinthians 4:5**).

“LISTEN TO THE OLD RUGGED CROSS!”

The death of Christ is the single most important event in human history. This does not lessen other great Bible events. However, every one of those events brings us to the redemption of mankind on the “OLD RUGGED CROSS.” It is a message of supreme importance!

What, then, does the Old Rugged Cross say to us? It declares -

WE CANNOT SAY THAT WE ARE NEVER INVOLVED WITH SIN! No one can say that he has not sinned or that he will not commit iniquity (1 John 1:8 10; Romans 3:23). The Scriptures tell us that the “wages of sin is death” (Romans 6:23). If one is not careful, he will become enslaved to sin (Romans 6:17 18). Those who had been servants of sin were set free from the consequences of those sins by their obedience to the gospel (Romans 1:16; Romans 6:23).

MAN CANNOT SAVE HIMSELF. In Titus 2:14, we observe the phrase, “... gave himself for us, that he might redeem us...” We cannot save ourselves from the consequences of sin (Titus 3:5). Salvation comes from the mind of God (Ephesians 2:1 10). Without the blood of Christ, there can be no salvation. (Romans 5:10; Hebrews 9:13 14; 10:1 4). It is through baptism that we avail ourselves to His cleansing blood (Romans 6:1-5; 1 Peter 3:21).

THE CROSS REVEALS OF GOD'S LOVE (Titus 3:3-7). Sin is so horrible and so overwhelming that men often just give up. We must never forget that God's love is wonderful and strong. He said, “I'll pay the price.” The cross of Christ demonstrates the proof of God's love for our souls (2 Peter 3:9).

THE OLD RUGGED CROSS ALSO TELLS OF THE POSSIBILITY OF SALVATION (Titus 2:14). Sin separates men from God (Isaiah 59:1-2). In that condition, we are lost. But the cross of Jesus makes reconciliation and salvation possible. There is power in His blood to redeem every man from every sin (1 Peter 1:18 19), to justify those who have gone into sin (Romans 5:10), and to bring about forgiveness so that our guilt is taken away (Ephesians 1:7).

Every man needs the message of the “old rugged cross.” Christ died for all of mankind. However, man is responsible for obeying the gospel (2 Thess. 1:7-9). God has given us the plan by which we can save ourselves (Acts 2:40-41). We must obey His will. Obedience requires hearing and believing the gospel (Mark 16:15 16), Repenting (Luke 13:3), Confessing (Romans 10:9 10), Baptism (Acts 2:38), then being faithful to the end (1 John 1:7; Rev. 2:10).
