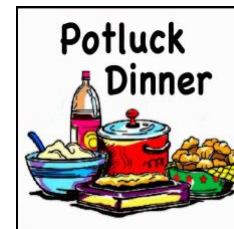

The Sin Of Silence.

Johnny Ramsey (7/5/1930 – 10/5/2006)

God's real servants must never close their mouths when Satan parades before the world, spouting errors of every sordid form. Here are eight great examples of men who did not seal their lips.

1. Nathan, the bold prophet, plainly said unto King David: "Thou art the man" (2 Sam. 12:7).
2. Micaiah, the prophet, withstood Ahab and his 400 wise men and used these words of emulation: "As the Lord liveth, what the Lord saith unto me, that will I speak" (1 Kin. 22:14):
3. John, the Immerser, severely warned the corrupt Pharisees who would have made a mockery of divine truths. Matthew 3 is a tribute to fearless preaching.
4. Jesus was uncompromising with a prospective follower when He told the rich young ruler about the challenge of kingdom service. Some of us try to ease prospects in and then teach them duty. Not so with the Master Teacher (Luke 18:18-30).
5. Peter, in Acts 5:29, before an aroused Jewish council, frankly, informed them that the apostles would "obey God rather than men." This is a refreshing change from our halting speech (1 Kin. 18:21).
6. Stephen, nearer to death with each sentence, nonetheless spoke clearly of the debauchery and shame of the Jewish leaders. His courage has given us the spark we need to oppose error. Read Acts 7 carefully.
7. Philip seized his opportune moment after running to his mission of importance, opened his mouth, and preached Jesus to the Ethiopian (Acts 8:26-39).
8. Paul, before Felix, chose the three most unpopular themes in his repertoire in preaching to his captor: righteousness, temperance,

and judgment to come. Plain preaching is powerful; even Felix trembled and considered the plea (Acts 24:25).

Brethren, heaven will be too sweet to miss. Yet, we shall miss its glory if we seal our lips when God's truth is burning within our souls. Sinners need it, the world will die and go to hell without it, and our souls will perish unless we open our mouths and speak forth the message of God's resplendent glory.

The "Not Hole"

When you order a suit, do you say, "Don't send sizes 32, 34, 36, 40, 42? And don't send cotton, silk, rayon, or leather?" Of course not! Instead, you tell them what you want, automatically eliminating the rest.

And yet, people often do not understand this in religion. They say, "But God did not say not to use instrumental music in worship." Or, God did not say, "He that is not baptized shall be lost." Or, "He did not say not to gamble, or not to do the modern dances, etc." Or, "He did not say not to smoke or chew tobacco." Or, "He did not say not to use alcohol as a social beverage." Or, "He did not say not to dress in immodest apparel and not to go mixed swimming."

No, that is right, but he did tell us what He wanted (Eph. 5:19; Mark 16:16; Eph. 4:28; Gal. 5:19-24). God tells us to "abide" in the things that are taught in the Scriptures (2 Tim. 3:14) and that "whosoever transgresseth, and abideth not in the doctrine of Christ, hath not God" (2 John 9). Let us resolve to do the exact will of God without addition or subtraction and without trying to pull anything in through the "Not Hole"!
