3. **In mansions of glory and endless delight**, I'll ever adore Thee in heaven so bright; I'll sing with the glittering crown on my brow: If ever I loved Thee, my Jesus 'tis now.

B. From this song let us observe...

I. THE FOLLY OF SIN – "FOR THEE ALL THE FOLLIES OF SIN I RESIGN."

A. The Folly Of Sin... (Lacking good sense... Wrong confidence, silliness.)

1. Consider the actions of the prodigal son when he "came to himself."

1) **Luke 15:17.**

2) **Psalms 85:8.**

2. It is Unprofitable. (The pay a terrible wage. **Rom. 6:23**).

B. Sin is a bad investment because of what it pays.

1. **Isaiah 59:1-2**: It separates us from God.

2. **James 1:15**: "...sin, when it is finished, bringeth forth death."

C. We must resign ourselves from sin. Moses did just that (Heb. 11:25**).**

II. THE FREEDOM IN CHRIST – "AND PURCHASED MY PARDON ON CALVARY'S TREE."

A. Sin enslaves. Read **John 8:33-34; **Romans 6:16**.**

B. Our pardon was paid in full at Calvary.

1. **1 Peter 1:18-19.**

2. **John 1:29.**

3. **Luke 23:33.**

C. Freedom in Christ.

1. Even though we are freed from sin, we are still servants.

2. **Romans 6:18** shows the needed change.
