“No Brainer”

Sometimes, when one must choose between two or more options, the right selection is so obvious that we do not have to think about it. We sometimes use the term “no brainer.” Many times in life, we face what should be “no-brainers.”

Let us notice some of them.

1. ***Attending the Worship Service.*** Whether we choose to attend worship services or stay home to visit family or friends, watch TV, or do something else should be a “no-brainer” for every Christian. When such a choice presents itself, there should be no question in our minds or in our friends’ minds where we will be.

If one is persistent in his attendance, our family and friends will soon learn that if they desire our presence, they will have to schedule them when the Lord’s people are not meeting. When our “priorities” truly take precedence in our lives, people will know it.

2. ***Taking that First Drink, Drugs, etc.*** When faced with the opportunity to take that first drink of alcoholic beverages or illegal drugs, this should be a “no-brainer” for our young people.

They face many temptations. Although “peer pressure” applies to every age group, it generally has its greatest strength during these formative years. No one likes to be called “chicken.” Young people are told, “everyone else is doing it,” and if they are not “doing it,” then they are less than normal.

There is an undeniable and irresistible law of life. Every alcoholic took that “first drink.” Every drug addict had a “first

time.” However, if young people are more concerned about what God thinks than what their contemporaries think, such occasions will be a “no-brainer.” Hopefully, that will always keep in mind that alcohol and drugs are sinful and lead to eternal death (1 Cor. 6:10; Gal. 5:21; 1 Pet. 4:7).

3. ***Laboring in God’s Vineyard.*** The greatest institution that has ever existed upon the earth is the church of Christ. It was in the mind of God from the beginning (Gen. 3:15). Its purchase price was the blood of His only begotten Son. The Church is the Lord’s bride, body, temple, and family. It is also His *vineyard*. This is the “work feature” of the Church. God intended for His “vineyard” to do various things: Evangelize, exhort, and be benevolent. These concepts suggest *work*, things that need to be done. The Church is capable of doing everything God intended it to do. His plan will work if we work in accordance with His plan! Thus, when occasions arise that demand “work,” we must arise. This should be a “no-brainer.”

Paul wrote, “For we are his workmanship, created in Christ Jesus unto good works, which God hath before ordained that we should walk in them” (Eph. 2:10). This could not be stated any clearer. Salvation is not *earned* – “Not by works of righteousness which we have done, but according to his mercy he saved us... (Titus 3:5). We are not the “new creature” because we have *worked*. But we are the “new creature” created unto good works.

Paul told Titus, “Who gave himself for us, that he might redeem us from all iniquity, and purify unto himself a peculiar people, zealous of good works” (Titus 2:14). Titus was to encourage the Christians to “...be careful to maintain good works. These things are good and profitable unto men” (Titus 3:8; 3:14).
