Just A Thought:

No atheist can injure the Bible's influence as thoroughly as a Christian who disregards it in his daily life.

“What Are You Looking for in a Church?”

Because they moved into a new community or have realized the need for religion in their lives, or maybe they are unhappy with their “old church,” many people are “looking” for a “new church home.” We would ask, ‘What are they looking for?’

1. Some follow family and personal traditions. These search for a church like the one they left behind.
2. Because they don’t want to travel far to “attend services,” some look for a church nearby.
3. Desiring to feel welcome and wanted, some look for a church with “friendly people.” We like friendly people who are sound in the faith.
4. Some look for a big church, where they can get lost in the crowd. Others look for a small church, where they can quickly get to know everybody.
5. Some only look for a church with many “youth activities” and “family things.”
6. Some want a church that is trying to “solve world problems,” committed to social reform and community improvement.

Now, if you will look back over that list, you will notice that nothing is said about seeking a church where they can worship and serve God according to His revealed will. Many people are looking for a church that pleases them, rather than a church that pleases God! If you are interested in finding a church that pleases God, look for the following attributes:

1. A church that respects the sovereignty of God and the authority of Jesus Christ, the Son of God.
2. A church that respects the Bible as the inspired Word of God, and the gospel of Christ as the power of God unto salvation.
3. A church that strives to be like the churches of the New Testament, in name, organization, teaching, work, and worship.
4. A church that is concerned about lost souls and eternal destinies.
5. A church that puts its emphasis on the spiritual needs of man, instead of their social desires.

The Lord’s Church vows to “speak where the Bible speaks, and to be silent where it is silent.” She strives to follow the instructions of our Lord and the

inspired writers in all things. These things should bring us happiness and motivate us to be present in every assembly. The congregation where we attend should be a beacon that shines in our community.

Obedying The Gospel

The word “gospel” literally means good news or good tidings. What does the Bible say that the gospel is? 1 Corinthians 15:1-4 says, “Moreover, brethren, I declare unto you the gospel....by which also you are saved, if you hold fast that word I preached to you, unless you believed in vain. For I delivered to you first of all that which I also received; that Christ died for our sins according to the scriptures, and that He was buried, and that He rose again the third day according to the scriptures.” Here we see the good news of the gospel is that Christ died, was buried, and was raised again on the third day. Also, notice, they were saved by the gospel.

In 2 Thessalonians 1:7-8, we read, “And to you who are troubled rest with us, when the Lord Jesus shall be revealed from heaven with his mighty angels, In flaming fire taking vengeance on them that know not God, and that obey not the gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ.” Here we see that vengeance will be taken on those who do not obey the gospel of Christ.

How do we obey the death, burial, and resurrection of our Lord so that vengeance will not be taken on us? Romans 6:3-5 says, “Know ye not, that so many of us as were baptized into Jesus Christ were baptized into his death? Therefore, we are buried with him by baptism into death: that like as Christ was raised up from the dead by the glory of the Father, even so we also should walk in newness of life. For if we have been planted together in the likeness of his death, we shall be also in the likeness of his resurrection.” So, we see in obeying the gospel, we are baptized into His death, we are buried with Him through baptism, and then just as Christ was raised up from the dead, we also are raised to walk in newness of life after baptism. Only after baptism are we born again, and our new life in Christ begins. Only in baptism does our old, sinful person die and our new person rises free from sin.
