“God Provides Our Every Need”

God has revealed Himself to mankind in very clear and unmistakable ways. The Roman letter states that the revelation from God causes men to be without excuse (Romans 1:20). He has revealed Himself in the created universe (Psalm 19; Romans 1:18-22) and in His written revelation (Hebrews 11:13; Romans 10:17). Thus, we can know who God is and what He expects from His creation. John, writing by inspiration, stated that eternal life and truly knowing God are joined together (1 John 5:13). James gives an insight into the character of God. To realize these attributes should cause men to have more respect for Him and move us to seek His favor. In James 1:17-18, we learn several things that all men should come to realize and appreciate.

Scripture clearly states that God is the provider of all good things. James 1:5 says, “If any of you lack wisdom, let him ask of God, that giveth to all men liberally, and upbraideth not; and it shall be given him.” The Greek emphasizes that giving is an attribute of God. This passage literally says, “Ask of the giving God,” or “God the giver” (Vincent’s Word Studies). This fact clearly sets apart the true and living God from the “dead gods” which were worshiped by the heathen and could give nothing! The God of the Bible possesses many valuable characteristics, each revealing His love and concern for all people.

GOD IS THE GIVER OF ALL THAT IS GOOD (James 1:17). God’s nature is to be loving, giving, kind, longsuffering, and forgiving. God is the source of all good things. His gifts are good and always beneficial to the recipients. Jesus Christ was given as the sacrifice for our salvation (John 3:16; Hebrews 9:26; 10:12). In James 1:17, the word “good” refers to that which is “useful” and “excellent.” The word “perfect” emphasizes the fullness and completeness of what He provides for us. And the word “above” points not to the universe nor to outer space, but to heaven itself. These gifts originated in heaven and came from God, who is the giver of life.

The way to salvation came exclusively from the mind of God and was given in a plan that all could understand! He gave the gospel which reveals the only plan for man’s redemption (Romans 1:16; 10:17). We have been given “the peace of God which passeth all understanding” (Philippians 4:7). These are the things that give hope that is sure and steadfast (Colossians 1:5, 23, 27). God has “given unto us all things that pertain unto life and godliness” (2 Peter 1:3).

GOD IS UNCHANGING (James 1:17). The phrase “with whom is no variableness, neither shadow of turning” (verse 17) emphasizes that God is unchanging. This fact

provides us with the security and stability necessary for a successful and happy life. It is comforting to know that Jehovah is unchanging. “For I am the LORD, I change not...” (Malachi 3:6); “Jesus Christ the same yesterday, and today, and forever” (Hebrews 13:8). In Titus, we read, “In hope of eternal life, which God, that cannot lie, promised before the world began” (Hebrews 13:8). It is wonderful to have that assurance.

God’s love is constant, and justice is not altered by circumstances or current trends (Romans 2:1, 11). God’s requirements for mankind are settled and unchanging. He has always required that all men believe in Him (Hebrews 11:6ff) and that they obey every one of His commandments (Hebrews 10:26-31; 11:1-38). This unchanging nature brings security and peace of mind, knowing our relationship with Him.

GOD CREATED MAN FOR A SPECIFIC PURPOSE (James 1:17). Man’s whole duty is summarized in Ecclesiastes 12:13-14, “Let us hear the conclusion of the whole matter: Fear God, and keep his commandments: for this is the whole duty of man. For God shall bring every work into judgment, with every secret thing, whether it be good or whether it be evil.” Man’s purpose is to honor Him by obeying His commandments. It may not be popular, but it is nevertheless God’s purpose for us. We are told to “Let your light so shine before men, that they may see your good works, and glorify your Father, which is in heaven” (Matthew 5:16).

THE GOD WE SERVE WILL REWARD THE FAITHFUL (Revelation 2:10; 1 Corinthians 15:58). The God we serve promised to favorably reward all who will be obedient. Men cannot please God without having faith (Hebrews 11:6). James 2:20 emphasizes the necessity of works coupled with faith, “But wilt thou know, O vain man, that faith without works is dead?” These works are those which are ordained (put in place beforehand). God prearranged a sphere of moral action in which all men are to walk. When we walk in the manner which God before ordained, there is an assurance of eternal salvation. When we “walk in the light, as he is in the light, we have fellowship one with another, and the blood of Jesus Christ his Son cleanseth us from all sin” (1 John 1:7). Walking in the light is to walk in truth (2 John 4).

God has promised salvation to those who are faithful. The apostle Paul penned the words, “I have fought a good fight, I have finished my course, I have kept the faith” (2 Timothy 4:7). Notice verse 8 as he spoke of the promised reward; “Henceforth there is laid up for me a crown of righteousness, which the Lord, the righteous judge, shall give me at that day: and not to me only, but unto all them also that love his appearing.” We can be assured that the God we serve will reward the faithful favorably.
