The Obedience of Noah

Genesis 6:15-7:23.

“By faith Noah, being warned of God of things not seen as yet, moved with fear, prepared an ark to the saving of his house; by the which he condemned the world, and became heir of the righteousness which is by faith” (Hebrews 11:7).

Noah’s obedience serves as an example for us for several reasons.

First, Noah’s obedience required that he make a start. The 120 years in Genesis 6:3 is most likely a reference to a one-hundred-and-twenty-year period that God allowed to expire before sending the flood, thus providing man with an opportunity to repent (2 Peter 3:9). Noah could have procrastinated, but he did not. Our obedience requires that we make a start. Unfortunately, many people procrastinate for a number of “reasons” (excuses? – too young, don’t know enough, pressured not to by my parents, etc.).

Second, Noah submitted to God’s plan. God gave Noah a specific plan whereby Noah and his family could be saved from the flood (Genesis 6:14-16). God has given us a specific plan whereby we can be saved from our sin (Romans 10:17, Mark 16:16, Acts 17:30, Romans 10:9, Acts 2:38, Romans 12:1-2). Noah did not have the freedom to alter God’s plan, nor do we. We must submit to all God has commanded (Genesis 6:22, Genesis 7:5, John 14:15, John 15:14). We often emphasize the necessity of confession and baptism but trivialize other commandments (ex: controlling our anger – Matthew 5:22, Colossians 3:8, modest dress – 1 Timothy 2:9, pure speech – Ephesians 4:29, Colossians 3:8, keeping our word – Matthew 5:33-37, and fairness in business matters – Romans 12:17).

Third, Noah shared God’s plan. The scriptures teach that Noah was a preacher of righteousness (1 Peter 3:19-20). We have a responsibility to

take the gospel to the lost. Consider Matthew 5:13-16, Matthew 28:18-20, along with 2 Timothy 2:2.

Fourth, Noah stuck to God’s plan. Because of Noah’s steadfastness, God “shut him in the ark” along with his family (Genesis 7:16). Christians are to remain steadfast (1 Corinthians 15:58) and refuse to give up (Galatians 6:9).

Are We Dependable?

Can God depend on you? Have you ever stopped to think about yourself as being dependable? Now, a dependable person will possess certain attributes that will be clearly seen:

1. They will always make time for the sick and afflicted (James 1:2).
2. They will always keep in contact with the members of the church who are shut in (James 1:27; Galatians 6:10).
3. They often volunteer for things that need to be done around the meetinghouse (Titus 3:1).
4. They will defend the innocent against unjustified charges (Exodus 23:6-7).
5. They will give of their income to support the church (1 Corinthians 16:1-2).
6. They will offer constructive suggestions to build up the church (Ephesians 4:15).
7. They will defend the faith (Jude 3).

Can God depend on us? We have been commanded to do His will (Mark 16:15-16; Galatians 6:1-2).

God spoke of Abraham’s character: Genesis 18:19 “For I know him, that he will command his children and his household after him, and they shall keep the way of the LORD, to do justice and judgment; that the LORD may bring upon Abraham that which he hath spoken of him.”
