INTRODUCTION:

2. I love Thee, because Thou hast first loved me, And **purchased my pardon** on Calvary's tree; I love Thee for wearing the thorns on Thy brow: If ever I loved Thee, my Jesus 'tis now.
3. **In mansions of glory and endless delight**, I'll ever adore Thee in heaven so bright; I'll sing with the glittering crown on my brow: If ever I loved Thee, my Jesus 'tis now.

B. From this song let us observe...

I. THE FOLLY OF SIN – "FOR THEE ALL THE FOLLIES OF SIN I RESIGN."

A. The Folly Of Sin (Lack of good sense... Folly = Wrong confidence, silliness.)

1. Consider the actions of the prodigal son when he "came to himself."
 - 1) **Luke 15:17.**
 - 2) **Psalm 85:8.**
2. It is Unprofitable. (The pay is terrible **Rom. 6:23**)
3. Sin is a bad investment because of what it pays.
 - 1) **Isaiah 59:1-2**: It separates us from God.
 - 2) **James 1:15**: "...sin, when it is finished, bringeth forth death."

B. We must resign ourselves from sin. Moses did just that: **Heb. 11:25**)

II. THE FREEDOM IN CHRIST – "AND PURCHASED MY PARDON ON CALVARY'S TREE."

A. Sin enslaves. **John 8:33-34; Romans 6:16.**

B. Our pardon was paid in full at Calvary.

1. **1 Peter 1:18-19.**
2. **John 1:29.**
3. **Luke 23:33.**

C. Freedom in Christ.

1. Even though we are freed from sin, we are still servants.
2. **Romans 6:18.**

III. OUR FUTURE HOME – "IN MANSIONS OF GLORY AND ENDLESS DELIGHT."
