WHAT WILL WE RESOLVE TO DO IN 2026?

It's that time of year again when millions of us make New Year's resolutions. And as usual, many of those resolutions will be forgotten in the first few weeks of the New Year. Resolutions can be helpful if we keep them in mind. They can help us accomplish things we wish to do in our lives. Our resolutions should be realistic and doable. If we are not careful, we set unreasonable expectations for ourselves. However, in the spiritual realm, we must resolve to make changes and resolutions that keep us close to the Lord. Here are a few suggestions for 2026 that are within the reach of every Christian.

I will be more resolved in my faith. Resolutions made without a firm determination to succeed will only lead to discouragement. For example, how many folks resolve to lose weight but have no strategy to help them achieve that goal? Similarly, the Christian who resolves to improve his spiritual life must be determined to do so. In Christ, there is a victory (**1 Corinthians 15:58; 1 John 5:4**). "Set your affection on things above" (**Colossians 3:2**), and through Christ, we will be successful (**Philippians 4:13**).

I will spend more time in prayer. Prayer is the Christian's lifeline. Through prayer, we petition our heavenly Father to help us in our lives (as well as the lives of others). Through prayer, we thank our loving Father for the generous blessings we enjoy. Prayer does work (**James 5:16**). What a wonderful thing it would be if every Christian resolved to be more prayerful every day. Being thus minded, we would be humble in our dealing with others. Don't forget to pray (**1 Thessalonians 5:17**).

I will study God's word more than before. Jesus said that the truth sets us free from sin (**John 8:32**). Are we known as the "people of the book," or have we become a people without the book? There was a time when members of the Lord's church were known as "book, chapter, and verse" people. Long ago, Hosea penned a sad description of God's people, "My people are destroyed for lack of knowledge" (**Hosea 4:6**). Whereas, the apostle Paul penned words that showed the value of studying God's word (**2 Timothy 2:15; 3:16-17**). Let us all resolve to know more about the Bible by January 2012 than we did at the beginning of the new year.

I will seek to teach someone the gospel. Without someone teaching the gospel, the lost will not hear it, they cannot believe it and will not know what must be done to be saved (**Romans 10:13-17; Acts 2:38**). The Bible teaches that preachers must be sent (**Romans 10:15**). And, please remember that preaching (proclaiming the good news of salvation) does not occur only from behind a pulpit.

We can send ourselves, or we can send others (**Acts 8:4; 11:22**). God's wisdom and power are at work, saving souls when the gospel is taught (**1 Corinthians 1:21; 2 Timothy 2:2**). How wonderful it would be if we all sought to teach those who are lost. Who will say with Isaiah, "Here am I! Send me" (**Isaiah 6:8**)?

I will be obedient to the Lord's will. Every Christian who desires to please the Lord in all things will want to obey Him every day. Our commitment to obeying Christ is motivated by our faith, hope, and love (**2 Corinthians 5:7-9; Colossians 1:23; 1 John 5:4**). Half-hearted obedience is not obedience! That attitude must become a thing of the past. Let us all resolve to "give our best to the Master." Salvation depends upon our giving, our best (**Hebrews 5:8-9; 10:35-39**).

More suggestions could be added to our list. Please take a serious look at your lifestyle and determine to make 2026 better than the past year. You know yourself better than anyone else (except, of course, for God). So, make some spiritual resolutions for 2026. And may the Lord keep us as we strive to keep those resolutions.
