ARE WE JUST TOO BUSY?

We live in an age when everything is changing at an incredible pace. We are always hearing about the advances in medicine, space exploration, and computer technology, just to name a few. We are even changing the way we carry out our everyday activities. We can do more now in less time than ever before. But are we really getting more done now than ever?

Maybe we need to ask ourselves, “How busy am I?” Are we so busy that we miss a social function? Are we so busy that we don’t spend time with our children? Are we so busy that we are tempted to miss church services, Gospel Meetings, or Bible studies? If we answered “yes” to either of these, we need to rethink our priorities and find a solution that removes the temptation to miss a gathering of God’s people.

While preparing this lesson, I was thumbing through the maps in the back of my Bible and noticed the journeys of the apostle Paul. The apostle was truly a busy man. If we consider the effort he put into these journeys, we must be impressed. Remember, he did not have a car, an airplane, or a train to travel by. Some of his trips covered vast distances in those days. Today, we have cars for short trips and jets for long trips to make them seem short.

Microwave ovens have shortened meal preparation time, and dishwashers have made cleanup much faster and easier. Yet, very often, we still find there aren’t enough hours in a day to study our Bibles or the next lesson for Bible class. Satan tricks us into believing there is just not enough time to do the work of the church or to study His word. When this happens, our soul is in grave danger, and of course, that is exactly what Satan wants.

Again, we need to ask ourselves, in light of God’s truth, how busy we are. We must be honest with ourselves and change whatever is hindering us from serving Him as He would have us serve. We must be willing to devote the majority of our time to God rather than the leftover portion He usually gets from us.

Let’s remember what Paul wrote in 1 Thessalonians 5:14-22, “Now we exhort you, brethren, warn those who are unruly, comfort the fainthearted, uphold the weak, be patient with all. See that no one renders evil for evil to anyone but always pursue what is good both for you and for

all. Rejoice always, pray without ceasing, in everything give thanks; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you. Do not quench the Spirit. Do not despise prophecies. Test all things; hold fast what is good. Abstain from every form of evil.

That sounds like a full-time job to me!

We must dedicate our lives to these efforts and to all the others found in God’s word. To do this, we must spend time learning His way for us through Bible study and meditation. And when an opportunity presents itself, such as Bible studies and worship services, Gospel Meeting, and the like, we must be ready and willing to be present.

I would like to close by challenging each of us to sit down with a pencil and paper and write down how much time we currently spend on God’s work. Then write down how much time we spend on ourselves. Remember that He has promised us eternity as the reward for a life of service now. What could we possibly spend our time on now that would compare with that promise? (Copied)

The article above is one I read some time ago, and I was impressed by its content. I often hear people say, “I just do not have time.” I know we are busy people, but we must take a look at how we spend our time. We must make some time for our families and for the church. The time we spend here is short, and eternity is far too long to leave God out of our daily plans. “Go to now, ye that say, Today or tomorrow we will go into such a city, and continue there a year, and buy and sell, and get gain: Whereas ye know not what shall be on the morrow. For what is your life? It is even a vapor that appeareth for a little time, and then vanisheth away” (James 4:13-14).
