WHO WILL FOLLOW JESUS?

“For even hereunto were ye called: because Christ also suffered for us, leaving us an example, that ye should follow his steps” (**1 Peter 2:21**). This is one of the reasons that He came into this world. It was often that



Jesus would not only invite but would command that men follow Him (**Matthew 4:19; 8:22; 9:9; Mark 10:21; John 1:43; 21:22; 12:26**). Clearly, He is to be our example, and we must be willing to follow Him.

It is amazing and inspiring to study His life, to watch as He handled the temptations and problems in life. He was always the victor. We should gladly follow His steps.

In following Jesus, where will His steps lead us? When we follow Him, His steps will lead us through the waters of baptism. Many today claim to follow Jesus, but they mock and ridicule the idea of baptism. This is inconsistent, for Jesus saw the necessity of it. Though He had no sins, He was immersed to “fulfill all righteousness” (**Matthew 3:13-15**). If we follow the steps of Jesus, they will lead us to baptism. Not only was He baptized, but He also commanded it (**Mark 16:16**). Will we follow Christ’s instructions or man ideas? Our place in eternity depends on our answer.

As we continue our study of following Jesus, His steps lead us to Gethsemane. There will be trials and tribulations for those who will follow Him. The way to heaven has its Gethsemane’s and we will be wounded trials along the way. He who was wounded for our transgressions, obeyed the Father for our benefit.

If Jesus’ steps had ended at the cross, think of the hopelessness that would have engulfed mankind. Thank God such is not true! We can rejoice as we read of His victory over death and the grave. We read of His steps into the portals of glory (**Acts 1:9-10**). This is one of the

greatest motivating factors for our following His steps in our lives. We know of the joy that awaits the faithful at end of the road (**Revelation 2:10**). Christ spoke of His resurrection, “Jesus said unto her, I am the resurrection, and the life: he that believeth in me, though he were dead, yet shall he live” (**John 11:25**). Jesus said, “... I am the light of the world: he that followeth me shall not walk in darkness but shall have the light of life” (**John 8:12**). Friends we must follow Jesus no matter what the cost might be.

When we follow Jesus, His steps lead us to worship. Even as a child, He went into the synagogue. Later He would go to the place of worship and stand up to read the law (**Luke 4:16**). No person can follow His steps and at the same time absent themselves from the public worship assembly. If the Son of God felt a need for regular communion with the Father, how much more should we yearn for the same strength that is found in our worship services. Surely, we can understand the benefits provided by the commandment; “Not forsaking the assembling of ourselves together, as the manner of some is but exhorting one another: and so much the more, as ye see the day approaching” (**Hebrews 10:25**). Christ is the only way to heaven. If we follow Satan, we will be led into sin, defeat, and finally into torment (**Revelation 20:10**). If we follow men, we will be lifted no higher than humans can reach. Following Jesus is the only sure way (**1 Corinthians 11:1**). We cannot follow Jesus without walking the narrow road.

TWO ROADS... WHICH WILL WE CHOOSE?

Life is filled with choices. Some are important, while others are not. The road we chose to travel through this life is of great importance. One road will carry us to eternal destruction, and the other leads to eternal life (**Matthew 7:13-14**). Two roads from which to choose! However, there is just one way to the pearly gates! Many “risk their souls on some new-made way, Thinking they will come to the gate some day; Oh, may they find out, ere their lives are done, That the old Cross Road is the only one.” The old Cross Road is the way paved with the precious saving blood of Jesus. Which road will we choose?
