“WILL WE MAKE A VISIT?”

One of the most productive things an individual member of a congregation can do is get personally involved in the work. Sometimes we may feel that we cannot do much, but there is something that everyone can do. We can all make a visit. Oh, everyone may not be able to go to the homes of others for our visit, but we can make a phone call or write a note. Every outreach is important and productive. Just remember involvement is the key to a successful congregation.

I am going to list several things that I found in an old bulletin. I believe we can put them to use in our evangelism work. The author is unknown to me, but the points are still useful. Together, you and I can make a difference! I am going to do better in this important area. Let's help each other. (Toney L. Smith)

1. A new couple visits our services. A few people speak to them. We send letters expressing our appreciation for their visit, but will they return? Often, their decision to return is based on what the membership does after their visit to worship. We all make sure they are welcomed at the services, but our follow-up may make the difference.
2. A lonely person is in the nursing home. The long days grow into weeks, and the weeks into months. Occasionally, someone stops by to visit, but often they feel forgotten.
3. An elderly member is at home. Because of health and advanced age, he or she cannot attend worship. In the past days, they never missed a service. They would really enjoy a visit from us.
4. A new family moves into town. They are unacquainted with the town and have no friends or relatives here. They have no church preference. If we make a visit, perhaps they will come to services and learn the truth.
5. A family places membership. Perhaps the preacher and elders will visit them. But it would mean a lot if several members of the congregation would take the time to make them feel welcome with a call, a card, or a visit.

6. A member of the congregation begins to miss services. The occasional miss becomes a pattern, and he is seldom seen anymore. Our visit and concern for them might make the difference in helping them come back to where they need to be.
7. A member of the church loses a loved one. We are usually quick to visit at the time of the bereavement and before the funeral, but what about the long hours of loneliness and adjustment after the funeral day, when the relatives have gone home?
8. A new convert is baptized and added to the church. We tell them how happy we are to have them as a new brother or sister, but do we continue to encourage them and teach them that this is a new beginning, not the end? Do we help them to remain faithful in living the life of a Christian?
