SEEK YE FIRST THE KINGDOM.

(Toney L. Smith – adapted from John Bowles)

Matthew 6:25-32 sets forth the contentment and confidence Christians should enjoy. God has made provisions for all who will follow His way. By His providence, He cares for His own. Matthew 6:33 gives a clear explanation of those who will receive the blessings He has promised.

The Lord's church was established on the day of Pentecost in Acts 2. It grew and prospered (Acts 4:4; 5:14) and was united upon the word of God (Acts 4:32). This strength is maintained when the principles of Matthew 6:33 are followed. The text divides itself into four parts: 1) **THE OBLIGATION**; 2) **THE OBJECT**; 3) **THE ORDER**; and 4) **THE PROMISE** connected to endless blessings.

I. THE OBLIGATION.

A. The passage encourages us to "SEEK."

1. Seek means to search diligently. (2 Timothy 1:17; Matthew 13:45-46)

B. Every Christian must put forth an effort to do good. (1 Corinthians 15:58; Philippians 2:12)

C. Earnestly SEEK the right way. (Luke 13:24)

II. THE OBJECT.

A. We are instructed to seek the kingdom of God and His righteousness.

1. The kingdom and the church are the same thing.
2. Matthew 16:18-19; Mark 9:1; Acts 2; John 3:3, 5; Colossians 1:13.

B. His righteousness. (Doing what is right with God.)

1. His commandments. (Psalm 119:172; 1 John 3:7)
2. To seek His righteousness requires that we obey when we find truth. (Acts 24:25)

III. THE ORDER.

A. This means the order of priority.

B. Putting things in the right order is a must. (Matthew 25:24-30)

C. What is first in our lives?

IV. THE PROMISE.

A. This is a conditional promise. (We will be rewarded **if** we "seek first the kingdom and His righteousness.")

B. God will bless us. (Ephesians 3:21; 2 Corinthians 9:8)
What do we seek first?

THINGS WHICH MAKE FOR PEACE.

(Toney L. Smith)

The letter to the brethren at Philippi is a unique epistle. It has been called a love letter because it is clear that Paul has great affection for this congregation. In Philippians 2:1-4, there is an appeal for peace and unity. Rather than correcting them in this area, it may be that the apostle is commending them for the care and concern they had for one another. However, he does speak of the need to help others to achieve this unity and peace (Philippians 4:2-3).

In these four verses, we clearly see an appeal for Biblical love and unity. He speaks of the REASON for the appeal, the BASIS for the appeal, and the "HOW TO" for accomplishing this peace and unity.

I. THE REASON FOR THE APPEAL.

A. It seems that Paul is writing to encourage them to continue in unity and peace.

B. Some have said it could be that there was division. (PHIL. 4:2; 2:3).

C. This letter seems to be encouraging them to maintain their unity and peace. (Phil. 1:3; 6).

II. THE BASIS FOR THE APPEAL.

A. "IF" means since it is the case. (Not perhaps...Since you have...)

1. Consolation in Christ. (Acts 9:31; John 14:27).
2. Comfort of love. (2 Cor. 5:14-15; John 14:15).
3. Fellowship of the Spirit. (1 John 1:1-3, 6-7).
4. Bowles of Mercies. (Col. 3:12-13).

B. Joy is evident in Paul's relationship with the Philippians brethren.

III. THE "HOW TO" OF THE APPEAL.

A. The way to accomplish verses 1-2 is seen in verses 3-4.

1. No Strife. Taking care of one another.
2. How does the church grow and prosper?
3. By staying true to God's word.

B. Notice the keys to a healthy congregation. (Phil 2:23).

IV. CONCLUSION:

A. Read Psalm 133:1.

B. Philippians 2:14-16.
